

May is Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month, a celebration of Asians and Pacific Islanders in the United States. This Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month, we celebrate and honor their gifts, culture, and historical and continued contributions to our nation, and our college. In 1992, Congress created AAPI Heritage Month in commemoration of the first Japanese immigrants to arrive in the country on May 7, 1843, as well as the contributions of more than 15,000 Chinese immigrants in the completion of the transcontinental railroad on May 10, 1869.

Asia and the Pacific encompasses a myriad of people from across the Asian continent, and across Oceania, including members from the South Asian, Southeast Asian, East Asian, Micronesian, Melanesian and Polynesian communities. Though the grouping of these communities under terms such as "Asian Pacific Islander" and similar variations of it includes all people of the Asian, Asian American and Pacific Islander ancestry, Asians and Pacific Islanders represent two distinctly different groups. As of 2000, "Asian" and "Pacific Islander" became disaggregated as two separate racial categories on the U.S. Census.

The vastness of the Asian and Pacific Islander communities spans a reach of more than 30 countries where over 100 different languages are spoken, and where the experiences are equally as varied. From our migration stories to our stories of colonial resistance, each reflects the continued resilience of the communities that comprise the Asian and Pacific Islander Identities and are highlighted in the work of prominent figures such as Dr.Haunani Kay Trask, Carols Bulosan, Yuri Kochiyama, Grace Lee Boggs, Pauline Park and Justice Mary I. Yu.

Thank you to our Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Pierce College students, staff and faculty who continue to join us in the fight towards building and sustaining a culture of anti-racism. We admire you and we're incredibly thankful for your talents, advocacy, and brilliance.

Juneteenth holds a special significance in the lives of Black Americans, and in our nation's history. While Independence Day is commonly and traditionally celebrated on July 4th. June 19th is a marker of Black independence, freedom and liberation. On June 19th, 1965, Union solders occupied Galveston, Texas and announced that slaves were now free from the rule and bondage of their slave masters. This historic occasion came two and half years later after President Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863. After June 19th, 1865, former slaves celebrated Juneteenth by delivering inspirational speeches, singing songs of jubilation and praise, and holding gatherings with family and friends centered on celebrating Black culture in all of its beauty, joy and greatness. Juneteenth implores us to recognize and center the humanity of Black people. Black people are remarkable in all of our shades of melanin; Black people are brilliant in all of our forms of knowledge creation, and Black people are innovative, constantly pushing the limits and boundaries of creativity and originality.


