2023 - 2024 AANAPISI SCHOLARSHIP

The Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institution (AANAPISI) Scholarship Program is a collaboration between APIA Scholars, AANAPISIs and the communities they serve to provide scholarships, expand institutional capacity, and mobilize local resources to help foster economic development.

The AANAPISI Scholarship is available annually to students attending APIA Scholars AANAPISI partner campuses including Pierce College!

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship awards range from one-time \$2,500 awards to multi-year \$5,000 awards.

In addition to scholarship funds, APIA Scholars have access to leadership development, workforce readiness, mental health resources, and other culturally-specific programming designed to support them through graduation.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Applicants Must:

- Be able to describe their ethnicity, heritage, or ancestry in relation to the countries, territories, or lands in Asia or the Pacific Islands
- Be a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the United States
 - Citizens of the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of Palau are also eligible to apply
- Plan to enroll as a full-time student, in an undergraduate degree-seeking program, during the during the Fall 2023 semester
- Have completed the 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Plan to attend one of APIA Scholars AANAPISI Partner Institutions during the Fall 2023 semester (or Winter quarter)



BFET can help you maintain your Basic Food benefits, access reducedcost childcare, and connect you to resources to help you stay in school.
