



ICS/EOC Interface TTT Course (G-191)

April 7th, 2009

Tacoma, WA

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this train-the-trainer course is to create a state recognized instructor base for delivery of the G-191 ICS / EOC Interface workshop for local jurisdictions. The overall goal of the G-191 course is to enable participants to develop ICS / EOC interface implementation strategies or action plans for their communities. The goal of the state sponsored train-the-trainer course is to provide trained and qualified facilitators for this workshop at the local level.

COURSE INFORMATION:

The train-the-trainer course will introduce the G-191 workshop curriculum to approved and qualified members of jurisdictional instructional teams. The instructor teams will in turn facilitate the workshop within their jurisdiction to enable participants to develop an effective interface between Incident Command and the Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- 1) Describe ICS principles.
- 2) Describe MAC/EOC principles.
- 3) Identify the roles of ICS and EOC during emergency operations.
- 4) Using scenarios analyze the ICS and EOC systems and identify various interface issues.
- 5) Apply ICS/EOC interface concepts in an exercise situation.
- 6) Begin developing an ICS/EOC interface action plan for your community.

TARGET AUDIENCE:

This offering is **specifically** for **Homeland Security Region 5** jurisdictional instructional teams, but **Region 2** is welcome to partner in the training .

Each jurisdiction should send an instructional team. Each jurisdictional instructional team should consist of **two** instructors:

- One instructor must have incident scene experience, having served in a Command and General Staff position for an incident that exceeded one operational period and required an Incident Action Plan.
- The second instructor must have EOC experience, having served in an EOC leadership position for an incident that required activation of the EOC beyond one operational period.

Both instructors on the team must provide documented completion of prerequisite course requirements with their application form. (See **Course Prerequisites** paragraph below)

COURSE PREREQUISITES:

Prior to enrollment in the G191 Train-the-Trainer course, applicants **must provide documentation of completion** for the following courses:

- **G775** EOC Management and Operations (* G275 will be accepted for completions prior to December 2007)
