TARGET AUDIENCE:

Emergency Management Coordinators, senior officials, key Emergency Operations Center (EOC) personnel.

COURSE OVERVIEW:

This course is designed as a general overview of EOC Operations and to aid in the planning-establishment of an EOC or validation of an existing EOC. This course will not provide training for individuals for position specific operations.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. Relate EOC operations to National Incident Management System (NIMS) requirements.
2. Describe the role that EOCs play in overall multiagency coordination.
3. Describe the relationship between the EOC and the on-scene Incident Command System (ICS) structure.
4. Identify staffing, information, systems, and equipment needs at the EOC.
5. Determine whether their EOC organizations are conducive to effective coordination.
6. Identify potential alternate locations suitable for EOC operations should the primary EOC facility become damaged or inoperable.
7. Create a test, training, and exercise plan for critical EOC operations.
8. Develop a strategy and schedule for reviewing EOC resource requirements and technology needs.
