- **\$1 million +** awarded in scholarships since 1994

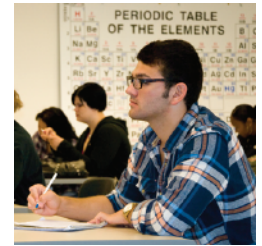

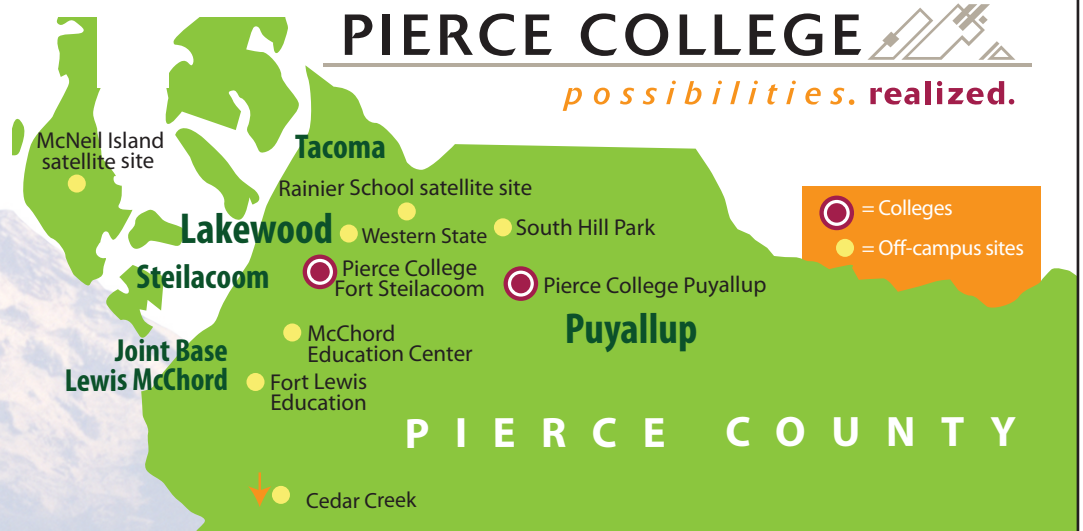
