Thanks for your interest in studying abroad in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil!

What is the Study Tour Program and how is it different from Study Abroad?

Study Tour programs combine the excitement of study abroad with the academic expertise of classes taught by Pierce College faculty. You will have the opportunity to earn Pierce College credits while studying in your host country. We strive to create inclusive programming by offering 2-week courses abroad that cater to working students, students with family commitments, and those who are cost conscious.

Study Tour tuition fees are equivalent to the cost of tuition on campus, with the only out of pocket expenses being airfare, reduced lodging and some meals. Please see Pg. 5 for more details on pricing.

You will have the opportunity to earn 5 credits towards your degree during the 2 week program- either HUM 101 or HUM 107. Both can count as a GTE/GE. Please check with your advisor to make sure the program courses fit with your academic plan.

When will the 2019 Study Tour occur?

The dates are: July 12^{th} SeaTac to Rio de Janeiro, return to Seattle July 29^{th}

Weekly Schedule:

Study Tour is not a vacation, it is an academic program grounded in experiential learning first and foremost, and will be treated as such. Classes will be held in the morning at your residence, the Cultural Center. The rest of your day you will spend on unique excursions and outings that are related to the content of the course. You will spend time in local museums with Brazilians translating for you, go on walking tours of neighborhoods, attend dance and capoeira events, and visit tourist sites and historic locations around Rio. The goal is to provide an enriching cultural experience, while still meeting all of the course outcomes and credit hours.

Please be aware, in order to meet the academic objectives of this program we will have a very full schedule throughout the week. You can expect to have most of the hours in your day occupied by cultural excursions, class time, social outings, and specially planned tourist activities. If you want a truly unique cultural experience, with the opportunity to learn about your host nation with the locals, and earn 5 credits through an engaging course curriculum, then this is the program for you.

What Will We Be Doing?

Learning through unique cultural experiences, and instruction by a Pierce College faculty member and faculty, staff and students of the host institutions.

Expectations for the City of Rio:

- Lodging is dorm style, you will be likely sharing a dorm room with a student or maybe 2 students of the same gender. We have a private, secure conference center with lodging, surrounded by gardens and a high gate.
- Although the lodging and classroom space is private, it is in the middle of the city! We will be taking group excursions to museums and cultural venues, as well as trips to the white sand beaches and famous botanical gardens.
- The metro from the Cultural Center will cost \$3 round trip. There may be group pass discounts, if we can buy them in bulk this cost may be included in the trip cost, but count on about \$30 for transportation just in case. We will know more of these details by the first orientation.
- Most meals are included in the trip cost. Students are responsible for all meals
 not included in the trip cost. We will go over a cost breakdown for this in this
 application as well as at our pre-departure orientation. 1 meal per day may be
 eaten while we are out on program activities.

A Typical Day on the Study Tour:

A few of the days will be excursions only, no class, but most days will have both an excursion and a class.

• Meet at 8am for breakfast at the hotel, and discuss the upcoming day over

breakfast.

- Reconvene at the classroom in the Center from 9am-11:30am for an interactive teaching session by your professor, Kathy Swart, on Afro-Brazilian music and dance.
- Take the metro together to Catete station and walk to the Museu da Republica, a historical museum, where a Brazilian historian will conduct a guided tour. A local Brazilian will translate and help students ask questions of the historian.
- Walk one minute down the street to Cariocando, a cozy restaurant decorated with Rio history and home to locals. It serves traditional Brazilian food such as feijoada, traditional black bean stew, and pasteis, fried turnovers with a variety of fillings.
- Work off our lunch by visiting the Museum's Historical Gardens before catching the metro back to Botafogo station.
- Eat dinner back at the hotel, then watch a movie in our own classroom.

Other tourist and class visits include:

- 1. Museums: Museum of the Republic, Imperial Palace Cultural Center
- 2. Historical places such as Cinelândia
- 3. Botanical Gardens
- 4. Ipanema Beach
- 5. The famous statue of Cristo on the hill
- 6. Cultural events involving capoeira and Afro-Brazilian dance
- 7. The island of Sugar Loaf, reached by sky-car
- 8. A cultural center in Santa Teresa for local children and/or a community of people displaced by the Olympics
- 9. We will do a workshop at the Theater of the Oppressed, a worldwide movement founded by Brazilian activist and dramatist Augusto Boal. Through series of exercises, games, and audience participation dramatic forms, the aim is to understand social reality and then be able to change it.
- 10. The "Hippie Fair," a great place to get souvenirs.

Study Tour Expectations

What You Can Expect:

In order for us to fulfill our program's mission and goals, it is imperative that all participants fully engage in all aspects of their Study Tour. Being a Study Tour participant requires time, energy, and commitment, including meeting requirements before, during, and after the Study Tour.

We Expect That You Will:

- Attend ALL pre-trip activities, meetings and the pre-departure orientation. Please note, these pre-trip meetings are mandatory for all participants.
- Begin the passport process as soon as you confirm your enrollment in the program. It can take several weeks to get your passport; you are financially responsible for the costs associated with obtaining your passport. Failure to get your passport in time and a copy turned into the IEO office by the indicated deadline will result in termination of your enrollment in the program. You will be held financially responsible for any portion of the program paid according to the cancelation schedule.
- You will need a tourist visa in order to gain entry to Brazil. You will need your
 passport before you can begin the visa process, it is imperative you begin this
 process early! Please visit the following website for instructions on obtaining your

- Adhere to the Pierce College Code of Conduct at all times. You are a representative
 of the College while abroad and should conduct yourself appropriately at all times.
 We have a zero tolerance alcohol and drug policy on all program sponsored
 activities, outings and events. We will review the terms of the Code of Conduct at
 our pre-departure orientation.
- Participate actively in any pre-trip fundraising events with your group to assist in covering the cost of the trip. Scholarships are available on a need basis.
- Participate actively in all aspects of your trip, including classes, reflection, and activities. You will respect others in your group and be willing to cooperate. You will be flexible, open-minded, and responsible as a representative of Pierce College.
- Understand that the use of drugs and alcohol is strictly prohibited. You will be expected to abide by the Pierce Code of Conduct throughout the trip.
- Insurance is MANDATORY, and is included in your deposit
- Adhere to the curfews and use of the "buddy system" policy for this program. Safety is
 our number one priority on all Study Tour programs, however safety and the policies
 and procedures associated with safety on the Brazil program are even more critical.
 Sneaking out, breaking curfew, excessive partying, and any other behavior that
 violates the Code of Conduct or interrupts the program in any way is grounds for
 immediate dismissal from the program at the students expense.
- Every student is individually responsible for the success of the trip and must exercise good judgment and cultural sensitivity, respect the rights and feelings of others, and observe the laws and customs of the host country.

In Return, You Can Expect To:

- Receive all imperative trip information leading up to your departure.
- Be educated about your trip location and host site.
- Have a once in a lifetime experience.
