### **Accessing Your Financial Aid Portal**

Many times, students are under the impression that completing the FAFSA is their only step to receiving aid. Unfortunately, this is not true. At Pierce College, the Financial Aid year begins with *summer* quarter. Often times, students are randomly selected for verification, which means our Financial Aid Department needs additional information to complete your financial aid file and will not award aid until all needed documents are submitted. Your FAFSA may also be incomplete, which may prevent your FAFSA from being reviewed. In the Financial Aid Portal you can do the following:

- Check your 2019-2020 financial aid award status and missing items
- Review your financial aid award
- Access financial aid forms and other important information posted from the financial aid office

To log into the Financial Aid Portal use the following:

**Username:** Social Security Number **Password:** Date of Birth (MMDDYY)

Once you log in to your portal using your username and password above, you will scroll down to the bottom of the webpage to "Information We Need" and you may or may not see a list of documents to be printed, filled out and turned in to the financial aid department. Please give the department at least two weeks upon receiving your additional documentation to begin to review your status. ## **In-Demand Occupations**

The April 2019 report on the Washington State Resident Civilian Labor Force and employment provided by Employment Security shows that the Unemployment rate in Pierce County is at 5.5% and at 2.8% in King County. Employer demand is still quite high for many areas. Below is a snapshot from the most recent Supply/Demand list from Employment Security of the top 30 occupational titles most "in-demand". It shows the gap between the number of job postings and number of individuals either completing a program in that field or having previously worked in that field and are now applying for Unemployment Benefits. The larger the negative number, the greater the demand.
