Course format and schedule

This is an online course. This course is available anytime, from anywhere, using web-based software.

The course is delivered via Canvas at <https://pierce.instructure.com>

Each week, a new module will be available. Modules include reading assignments in the text and information in Canvas on key topics and exercises. Each week will have one or more assignments and quizzes, which are due the following week.

Ask yourself: What will be most challenging for me with an online course? How can I schedule my week to meet the due dates for class assignments? What resources (people and things) could help me meet this challenge?

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Types of work you can expect in this course

There will be different ways to help you learn about project management:

- You will have reading assignments from the text and Canvas
- You will have videos to experience project management lessons visually
- You will complete template/documents and quizzes every week.

Class project

The course includes a class project that “simulates” the development of a project plan. The simulation provides an opportunity to apply the skills learned in the course.

The instructor will walk you through the completion of a template/document. The templates will be in Word, Excel, or PowerPoint. At the end of the walk through, you will submit your completed template/document for grading.

All class project templates/documents will be followed by a Quiz. You can take the quiz once; however, you can use your template/document as a guide. The quizzes are automatically graded in Canvas and you can see your score immediately after completion.

Discussions

There will be several discussions during the course. The discussions provide an opportunity to discuss aspects of project management with colleagues who have different viewpoints and experiences. Discussions are two parts, requiring both an original response to the discussion activity, and two meaningful replies to fellow classmates that contribute to their learning.

Please remember to use standard netiquette rules of respect, civility and constructive discourse when posting, replying and providing feedback.

Quick quizzes

Throughout the course there will be Quick Quizzes. They usually pertain to information just covered in Canvas.

The Quick Quizzes are multiple choice, fill in the blank, etc. There will only be two opportunities to improve your score. The quizzes are automatically graded in Canvas and you can see your score immediately after completion. The highest score will be used for grading.

Weekly quizzes

At the end of each week there will be a quiz posted on Canvas. They usually pertain to information in the text and the class project.

The quiz will pull ten multiple choice questions from a database of questions. You can take the quiz two times; however, the questions may be different the second time.

There will be no make-up chapter quizzes. If you miss a quiz, you will earn a zero.

The quizzes are automatically graded in Canvas and you can see your score immediately after completion. The highest score will be used for grading.

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Final exam

The final exam uses the same format as the Weekly Quizzes; pulling ten multiple choice questions from a large database of questions from each weekly module covered during the quarter. The final exam will be available and due per the school schedule.

The final exam will be posted on Canvas and there will be two opportunities to improve your score. However, the questions may be different the second time.

There is no make-up final exam. If you miss the final exam, you will earn a zero.

The final exam is automatically graded in Canvas and you can see your score immediately after completion. The highest score will be used for grading.

Schedule ample time (2.5 to 5 hours per week) to prepare for the upcoming week by reviewing all of the learning resources and completing all assignments and quizzes:

Class Project Walk-through – An online walk-through with the instructor is provided for every Class Project document:

- At the beginning of the walk-through, you will find a template to fill out. You can use the completed template (Project Document) to help you with the Quiz that follows.
- Each project template/document is broken down into sequential sections with Instructor’s explanations, comments, and suggestions.
- By the end of the walk-through, the template/project document will be completed, submitted, and you will be ready for the Quiz.

Ask questions and ask for help. If you are confused for more than 15 minutes, ask for help. You have several options:

- Form a study group. Consider using many of the free conferencing services: Zoom, Skype, and Canvas/Cranium Café.
- Use the Questions and Answer forum (in Canvas)
