The Year by the Numbers



195 international students* studied at Pierce.

Of those,

- **35** students studied in the Intensive English Program.
- **35** students participated in short-term programs during the summer.
- 51 international students graduated this year.
- 47 countries of origin were represented: the leading countries were Kenya, China, the United Arab Emirates, South Korea, Japan and Vietnam.
- **19** Pierce students studied abroad in Japan.
- 15 info sessions were organized.
- **14** alumni elected to complete optional practical training this year.
- **13** events were held, three of them in collaboration with partner offices.

International Visitors

We welcomed two Humphrey Fellows for a one-week Community College Residency Program (CCRP) in winter quarter.

The Humphrey Fellows Program is a Fulbright exchange program for mid-career professionals from all over the world. Humphrey Fellows take graduate level courses at partner U.S. universities and participate in professional and leadership development opportunities throughout the year, one of which is the one-week residency at a community college.

Our two visiting Fellows were Elyin Loaisiga from Nicaragua and Habib Alnedari from Yemen, both studying the effects of climate change. While at Pierce, they each gave a public lecture, conducted class visits, met with several faculty, and gave a presentation at a local high school.

We loved having the opportunity to bring their global perspectives to Pierce and hope to welcome other visiting scholars in the future.



Outreach Travels

After a long pause due to COVID-19, we are pleased to resume our strategic travel campaigns to key markets and engage with potential applicants and partners in person. These face-to-face meetings are essential for establishing trust and provide us with the opportunity to understand the cultures and educational backgrounds of international students at Pierce.

In this past academic year, we attended educational fairs, met with existing partners, and delivered presentations in South Korea, Vietnam, Mongolia, Japan, Taiwan, Germany, and Canada. Although it takes time to see the full impact of our efforts, we are observing improvements in partnerships and are forging new opportunities.









2023 Japan Study Tour



In late summer 2023, 18 students participated in a study tour to Japan led by Profs. Min Pak and Dave Roholt. The program highlighted arts and culture in Osaka & Kyoto with a focus on experiential learning. The students participated in a fabric dying workshop, tried out wood cut printing, and met with students at the Osaka College of Foreign Languages. The students' artwork, recorded in beautiful accordion books, was shared at a Board of Trustees meeting earlier this year.
