Pierce College's Criminal Justice program prepares students for the rigors and responsibilities of these demanding careers. From traditional classroom instruction to "in-the-field" internship opportunities, criminal justice students at Pierce College will receive the balanced training, experience and connections they need to begin a rewarding career in the legal system.

One such student is Davon Gray, who came into the Pierce College criminal justice program with two years of experience as a deputy sheriff in the Jefferson Parish sheriff's office near New Orleans, Louisiana.

Originally from Maryland, Davon knew he was interested in a career in criminal justice but wasn't sure if going to school would be the right path for him. To finance his education and his goal of eventually attending law school, Davon turned to military service.

"Serving in the military has been an incredible opportunity for me," Davon said. "It's a great environment and allows me the ability to volunteer and pursue my passions."

In 2024, Davon was honored with the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal – awarded to members of the military who perform substantial volunteer service to the local community. Davon was presented with this award after spending over 1,000 hours volunteering with the North Thurston Public School District and other community groups.

"I'm very passionate about volunteering in the school system because those kids are our future replacements, and we have to maximize the presence of good role models

at an early age," Gray said, adding that he's passionate about mentoring teens that are at risk of being a statistic in the criminal justice system. "A lot of communities lack proper resources for young adults, so I'm trying to bridge the gap."

Also in 2024, Gray received the 2024 Military Academic Achievement Award alongside a handful of other military students at Joint Base Lewis-McChord's Stone Education Center.

Gray joined the U.S. Army Reserves in 2017 before transferring to active duty in 2022. Soon after he began his tenure as a U.S. Army construction engineer, Davon heard about Pierce College from a fellow service member.

"He just told me "man, they have a really great program,"" Gray said. "I walked in, and right away everyone was so friendly, it immediately felt like such a great atmosphere."

Davon's ultimate educational goal is to earn his Juris Doctorate and become a juvenile attorney; after graduating from Pierce College, Davon will attend Washington State University to receive his Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice and Law Enforcement Administration.

At Pierce College, students have several choices when pursuing a career in the criminal justice system. The associate degree in applied sciences in criminal justice is a part of the direct transfer agreement program – these transfer degrees satisfy the first two years of coursework required for four-year degrees at public colleges and universities in Washington at a fraction of the cost. Students can also pursue a certificate in criminal justice, crime analysis and investigations, or forensic technology; or an explorer cadet pre-law enforcement certificate.

Pierce College criminal justice courses can be taken online, hybrid, or in-person at our Puyallup, Fort Steilacoom and Joint Base Lewis-McChord campuses.

"The structure of Pierce College has really worked for me," Gray said. "Pierce is well-organized, and I've always been able to find the help I needed."

Davon's favorite course was Criminal Justice 200 with Dr. Phillip Clingan – the Chair of the criminal justice department at Pierce College.

"Dr. Clingan is a great professor and I'm very passionate about his courses," Gray said. "We discussed things that would make the average person feel uncomfortable, but they should be discussed like white supremacy groups, the structure of the criminal justice system and the inequalities that many people face because of that structure."

In the fall of 2023, Davon received the Pierce College Outstanding Student Award. Clingan said Pierce College is a better institution, and the criminal justice department is stronger because of Davon's dedication to learning, commitment to helping students be successful and the kindness he shares with his community.

"Davon is in the top 5% of his peers in the Criminal Justice degree program," Clingan said. "He is an inspiration. Despite any struggles he has endured, each day he comes to class with a smile on his face and a willingness to learn and improve. He tackles issues and challenges with a positive can-do attitude."

In addition to his job as a construction engineer in the U.S. Army and his volunteer work, Davon works as a peer tutor, helping other Pierce College criminal justice students. He also hosted weekly sit-in sessions students can join to discuss topical criminal justice issues. Davon said he's treated his job as a peer tutor as an opportunity to be an "open-door" for other criminal justice students.

"Anybody can walk in from the criminal justice program and I'm available to help with entry level courses all the way to the top-level pathway courses," Gray said. "Interacting with people who are interested in criminal justice, who are just as passionate about making change as I am, is what I like about working as a tutor."

Davon started his educational journey later than some and says it's never too late to begin – especially for someone like him.

"Being a part of the African American community, so much has changed for us over time," Gray said. "We weren't always awarded the opportunity to go to school, become educated and reach our goals. You have to take advantage of the opportunities offered to you. If you want to do it, go after it and never give up on your dreams and hopes."

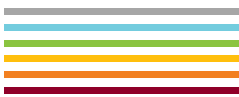

Running Start is a statewide college program for academically qualified junior and senior high school students to enroll in courses to fulfill high school graduation requirements and earn college credit.

RUNNING START BASICS

- Dual credit program for HS juniors and seniors
- Available fall, winter, and spring terms
- May take up to 15 college level credits per term
- Tuition paid through Running Start
- Students qualifying for fee waiver can take up to 20 credits
- 15 credits = full time class load
- 100-level courses and above
- 1 high school credit = 5 college credits

PIERCE COLLEGE STUDENTS AND STAFF RECOGNIZED AT MILITARY AWARDS CEREMONY

Pierce College students, faculty and staff were honored at Joint Base Lewis-McChord on Nov. 21 at the annual Military Academic Achievement Awards ceremony. Corporal Witchelson Souverain and specialist Davon Gray received the 2024 Military Academic Achievement Award, along with a handful of military students from other colleges at JBLM's Stone Education Center.

Instructor and classroom support technician Erin Kaech received the 2024 Commander's Certificate for Distinguished Faculty, and fiscal specialist Shondi Thomas received the 2024 Commander's Certificate for Distinguished Staff. Pierce College at JBLM provides educational opportunities for active-duty military personnel, and their families, as well as VA benefit recipients and civilians in the community.

CPL Witchelson Souverain

Originally from Haiti, Souverain joined the U.S. Army in 2022 as a private, but his leadership and drive have fast-tracked his military career. Cpl Souverain is a husband, a father, and an accomplished Pierce College student with dreams of one day becoming an astrophysicist and astronaut. Assigned to the 21st Inland Cargo Transfer Company as a petroleum supply specialist, Souverain is a three-time Best in Squad recipient for 2022, 2023 and 2024, and completed the Basic Leader Course in August 2024 while enrolled full-time in the rigorous associate of science degree at Pierce College. Souverain's student success coach, Yubi Lowjewski, said his "commitment to personal and academic development is unwavering as he serves the country."

SPC Davon Gray

Spc Gray, who attended the event via video call while on a nine-month deployment in South Korea, is a horizontal

construction engineer with the 23rd Brigade Engineer Battalion. In the last three years, Gray has spent more than 1000 hours volunteering in youth programs for students in the North Thurston and Pierce County school districts, which earned him the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal in 2024. He says he volunteers to be the kind of role model for youth that he needed growing up. Gray joined the U.S. Army Reserves in 2017 before transferring to active duty in 2022. He joined the service to serve his country and pursue his educational goal of ultimately earning a Juris Doctorate and becoming a juvenile attorney. The chair of Pierce College's criminal justice program, Phillip Clingan, said Gray is in the top 5% of students in the program, and is a "fascinating man who gives his community his all."

Erin Kaech

Kaech joined Pierce College at JBLM in 2006 after earning a bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry from Drury University. As an Instruction and Classroom Support Tech for the science labs at Stone Education Center, Kaech has helped thousands of students in her 18-year career at Pierce College. After earning her master's degree in bioinformatics, Kaech began teaching biology and chemistry courses at Pierce College at JBLM. Kaech says science is not only her profession, but also her passion; and she finds deep fulfillment when former students return to share their successes.

Shondi Thomas

A Veteran of the U.S. Army, Thomas said she wanted to work with military students to continue the family legacy of service going back generations. Thomas joined Pierce College at JBLM in 2023 as a Fiscal Specialist and quickly became essential in the College's conversion to a new technology system. Interim Executive Director of Pierce College at JBLM, Kelly Benson said Thomas "exemplifies the commitment to our mission." Recently, Thomas dedicated herself to advancing her own education and is currently pursuing a master's degree in Higher Education Leadership and Administration.



Introducing ANNUAL ENROLLMENT AT PIERCE COLLEGE

At Pierce College, our students are often juggling classes with work, parental, and life responsibilities. In order to better serve our students and continue to strive toward our mission of creating quality educational opportunities for a diverse community of learners to thrive in an evolving world, Pierce College now offers annual enrollment.

The annual enrollment process allows students to sign up for classes in multiple terms, for the current academic year, all at once. This change has made scheduling classes more transparent, allowing our students to see courses available in future terms and plan their courses, work, and lives more effectively.

Registration for the 2025-26 academic year (including summer, fall, winter, and spring terms) will open on May 12 for current students to enroll in courses for summer, fall, winter, and spring terms. When new student registration opens on May 27, new students will be able to do the same.

Students are not required to enroll in multiple terms at once, however, we encourage students to meet with their advisors and register early to get the courses and professors they want. Advisors will be available to provide support as you work on degree plans and scheduling moving forward.

The financial aid schedule and tuition deadlines will remain the same.



FUNDS FOR COLLEGE

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN GOING TO SCHOOL?



The following resources are available to assist with tuition and additional supports while earning a certificate or degree.



Federal and state grants may be awarded to students with financial need. Unlike loans, these do not need to be repaid. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA) each academic year to receive aid.



Student loans are borrowed money that must be repaid. Some loans are based on financial need, while others are not.



Work Study provides part-time employment to students. This program is available to students enrolled at least part time, and allows students to work both on and off campus. The funds do not need to be repaid.



Scholarships are available from both the college and outside sources. Some scholarships are open to all students in any program, while other scholarships are limited to students in specific programs.



The Washington College Grant provides guaranteed college funding through the state to all eligible residents of Washington state, including low- and middle-income students. The first step toward getting funding through the grant is to complete a federal or state financial aid application: Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA).

For those who qualify, the grant guarantees that you'll get the full Washington College Grant award that you qualify for, eliminating wait lists and letting you start college any quarter with your full grant award.



Veterans Benefits are available to assist both veterans and spouses/dependents of veterans.



Worker Retraining may assist with the costs of tuition, books, and transportation for individuals who have received unemployment benefits in the last 48 months, veterans who have separated from the military in the last 48 months, or active duty service members who will separate within the next 12 months.



Opportunity Grants may assist with the costs of tuition, fees, books, and support services to low-income students in an approved program.



WorkFirst may assist with tuition, books, and support services for students receiving TANF, referred by DSHS, and pursuing an eligible program.



BFET (Basic Food Employment & Training) may assist with tuition, books, and support services for students receiving SNAP and pursuing an eligible program.

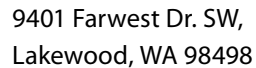

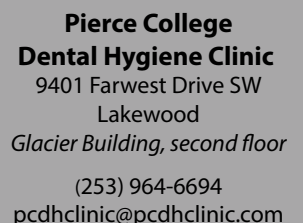
