The rates in the chart above are effective from Fall Term 2024 through Summer 2025, set by the Washington State Legislature and regulated by the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges (SBCTC). Tuition and fees (mandatory operating fee, building fee and S&A fee) are charged per credit and by residency.

Transitional Education classes are \$25 a term! Brush up on the basics, earn your GED, or improve your English with English as a Second Language (ESL) classes. Running Start tuition is FREE! Junior and senior high school students can earn college credit while completing high school graduation requirements. Are you: Unemployed or underemployed? Veteran or soon to be veteran? Worker etraining funding could be for you and doesn't need to be paid back.



Remember: most Pierce College students who apply for financial aid do not pay full cost! Money for college is out there. Reach out and grab it!

The most important step in financing your education is to apply for financial aid. Financial aid helps students pay for college. This financial assistance can cover educational expenses including tuition and fees, books, supplies, and transportation. There are several types of financial aid, including grants, scholarships, work study, and loans. You may be eligible for a combination of these various types of aid. Fill out your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WAFSA). Complete one of these forms every year, even if your family income is high. You might find you are eligible for financial aid that doesn't have to be paid back. How can you say no to free money?

Need more free money? There are many federal and state grants available, like the Washington College Grant, that don't have to be paid back, plus a variety of scholarship opportunities.

The Pierce College Foundation awards more than \$100,000 in scholarships each year and grants more than \$20,000 toward helping students with basic life expenses.
